Emma and her team are now fully trained to offer High Intensity Focused Ultrasound,

also known as a non-surgical or lunchtime face lift, which targets deep structural layers of the skin with heat, without damaging the surface, to achieve a natural lift by stimulating the skin's cells to produce kick start dormant collagen as well as producing new collagen.

The treatment can lift, firm, tighten and sculpt the face, brow, neck and jawline, as well as the chest, hands and other parts of the skin and body. Clients can also now opt for radiofrequency microneedling, which uses ultra-fine needles to penetrate the skin to different depths, while simultaneously releasing radiofrequancy energy to heat the skin, leading to the production of new collagen and elastin, to reduce signs of ageing.

It can be used to target wrinkles and fine lines, acne and surgical scars, crepey neck skin, loose and sagging skin, uneven skin tone and texture as well as pigmentation and large pores.

"Plenty of beauty salons offer great massages and manicures, but few can help people with specialist treatments for skin concerns," says Emma, who lives in Hatch Warren with her husband and two daughters.

"This is where I want to focus in future because the benefits make such a difference to how people feel and their confidence in themselves."

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
